India-Japan Defence Ministers Meet to Deepen Bilateral Ties Amid Global Security Challenges

High-Level Bilateral Engagement in New Delhi

- Defence Minister **Rajnath Singh** will host **Japanese counterpart Gen Nakatani** in **New Delhi on May 5, 2025**, to review and strengthen **defence cooperation**.
- This will be the **second meeting within six months**, following their **first dialogue in November 2024** during the **ASEAN Defence Ministers' Meeting-Plus** in Laos.

Shared Strategic Outlook on Global & Regional Security

- Talks will **focus on regional and international security developments**, including the **Indo-Pacific, East and South China Seas**.
- **China's increasing military presence** in strategic waters will be closely examined.
- The meeting follows **Japan's strong support** for India post the **Pahalgam terrorist attack**, highlighting joint commitment against terrorism.

Bilateral Defence Cooperation: Growing in Strength

- India and Japan share a **Special Strategic and Global Partnership** since **2014**, emphasizing **defence and security** as core pillars.
- Defence exchanges have grown due to a **convergence on strategic priorities** and commitment to **regional peace, security, and stability**.

Reciprocal Supply and Services Agreement in Focus

- Discussions to revisit the **Reciprocal Provision of Supply and Services Agreement**, first deliberated in November 2024.
- The agreement aims to **enhance military interoperability**, enabling **use of each other's bases** for repair, replenishment, and logistics.

Boosting Defence Industrial Cooperation

- Both sides are expected to explore **new avenues for defence industrial collaboration**.
- Emphasis on **joint development and production** of defence equipment, tapping into each nation's **technological strengths**.

Commitment to Indo-Pacific Peace and Stability

- Both nations advocate a **free, open, and inclusive Indo-Pacific region**.
- The Indo-Pacific strategy remains central to bilateral cooperation, with shared interests in **countering assertive military posturing**.



Tensions on the Global Stage: UN Security Council Convenes Over India-Pakistan Row Post-Pahalgam Attack

Background & Context: A Region on Edge

- On **April 22, 2025**, a **terror attack in Pahalgam, Jammu & Kashmir**, claimed **26 lives**, sparking sharp diplomatic escalation between **India and Pakistan**.
- India attributed the attack to **cross-border terrorism** originating from Pakistan and responded with **strong retaliatory diplomatic measures**.
- Pakistan has **denied responsibility**, calling for a **neutral international investigation** and accused India of **"aggressive actions."**

India's Response: Firm Measures Post-Attack

- India **suspended the Indus Waters Treaty**, citing Pakistan's **"sustained cross-border terrorism"**.

- Diplomatic retaliation included:
 - **Expulsion of Pakistani military attachés**
 - **Closure of the Attari land border transit post**
 - **Shutting Indian airspace to Pakistani flights**
 - **Termination of trade relations**, including through third countries.
- India warned the **UN** against Pakistan using global platforms for “**baseless propaganda.**”



Pakistan's Diplomatic Push: Appeal to the UN

- Pakistan approached the **United Nations Security Council (UNSC)** to convene a **closed-door consultation**, citing India's “**provocative statements**” and **actions**.
- Pakistan's Foreign Office said it would present “**accurate facts**” and urged the UN to intervene, claiming a threat to **regional peace and security**.
- It also **rejected India's suspension of the Indus Waters Treaty**, calling it **illegal** and a potential “**act of war**”.

UN Security Council's Role & Reactions

- The **UNSC meeting** was scheduled for **May 5, 2025**, under the **Greek Presidency** of the Council.
- The 15-member body includes **5 permanent members** (US, UK, France, Russia, China) and **10 non-permanent members**, including **Pakistan** and **Greece**.
- **Ambassador Evangelos Sekeris**, Greece's Permanent Representative to the UN and current UNSC President, stated:
 - “**Terrorism must be condemned everywhere.**”

- Expressed concern over mounting regional tensions.

Referred to India as “**far bigger**” than Pakistan, indicating diplomatic weight and global influence.

NATIONAL EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS INITIATIVE

- **Mock Drills Scheduled for May 7, 2025:** The Union Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA) has directed all states to conduct **nationwide civil defence mock drills** on **May 7** in response to heightened security threats following the recent terror attack in **Pahalgam, Jammu and Kashmir**.
- **Drill Objectives and Scope:** The drills aim to **test and strengthen civil defence mechanisms** across **244 designated ‘civil defence districts’**, simulating wartime or terror emergencies involving **air raids, chemical attacks, and coordinated terror strikes**.

Ten Critical Exercises Included

The comprehensive drills will involve:

- Activation of **air raid sirens**
- **Training students and civilians**
- **Blackout rehearsals**
- **Camouflaging of critical infrastructure**
- **Evacuation plan rehearsals**
- **Radio communication** checks with the Indian Air Force
- **Warden and emergency service activations**
- **Bunker cleaning operations**
- **Control room functionality tests**

- **Civil defence plan updates**

TERROR ATTACK BACKDROP: PAHALGAM INCIDENT

- **Pahalgam Terror Attack: Trigger for Preparedness:** The **May 2025 Pahalgam terror attack** resulted in **26 fatalities**, intensifying security concerns. **India has blamed Pakistan**, though **Islamabad denies involvement**. The drill is seen as part of the national response to prevent further incidents.
- **Pakistan's Role Under International Scrutiny:** India is urging international bodies like the **Financial Action Task Force (FATF)** to re-evaluate Pakistan's standing, pushing for its inclusion in the '**Grey List**', citing its alleged support to terror outfits.

GLOBAL & DIPLOMATIC RESPONSES

- **Russia Extends Full Support to India:** Russian President **Vladimir Putin** personally called **PM Narendra Modi**, expressing solidarity and vowing to support India in **bringing the perpetrators to justice**.
- **UN Condemns Civilian Targeting:** **UN Secretary-General António Guterres** condemned the targeting of civilians as "unacceptable" and offered to help **de-escalate tensions**, though he avoided backing military retaliation.
- **UN Security Council's Informal Session:** A **closed-door meeting** was held by the **UN Security Council** at Pakistan's request to discuss Indo-Pak tensions. **No official records or minutes** were documented.

DIGITAL & INFORMATION SECURITY

- **Crackdown on Anti-National Content:** The **Parliamentary Committee on Information Technology** has urged legal action against **social media influencers** promoting **anti-national, Islamophobic, or divisive content**, particularly following the Pahalgam attack.
- **Government Report Due by May 8:** The Committee has demanded a **detailed report** on the spread of misinformation and hate content from the **Ministry of Electronics and IT**, to be submitted by **May 8, 2025**.

INTERNATIONAL DIPLOMACY & DEFENCE COOPERATION

- **India-Japan Defence Talks:** Defence Minister **Rajnath Singh** met with his Japanese counterpart **Yasukazu Hamada**, who reaffirmed **Japan's full support** and discussed **joint anti-terrorism strategies**.
- **Multilateral Support Against Terrorism:** India raised the Pahalgam issue with the **Asian Development Bank (ADB)**. Finance Minister **Nirmala Sitharaman** urged a review of **funding to Pakistan** in light of the attack.
- **Internal Security Briefings:** Defence Secretary **Rajesh Kumar Singh** met with **PM Modi** to brief on current threats and national security strategies post the Pahalgam incident.

STRATEGIC CIVIL DEFENCE PLANNING

- **Focus on Swift Civilian Response:** This large-scale civil defence mobilisation aims to build a **disciplined, informed civilian response network**, reinforcing India's readiness for **wartime contingencies** or **cross-border threats**.

- **Historic Significance of Civil Defence Drills:** This marks one of **India's largest mock drill operations** since the **Kargil War era**, reflecting the government's commitment to **preparedness, deterrence, and national resilience**.

Israel Approves Strategic Plan to Capture Gaza

Military Offensive: Key Strategic Developments

- **Security Cabinet Approval:** Israel's security cabinet unanimously approved a comprehensive plan to *capture and hold Gaza*, with the primary aim to *destroy Hamas and rescue remaining hostages*.
- **Planned Ground Expansion:** The plan, proposed by Chief of Staff Lt Gen Eyal Zamir, involves *permanent troop deployment*, expansion of the *Israeli-controlled buffer zone*, and *displacement of Gaza's population* to southern areas.
- **Reservists Mobilised:** *Tens of thousands of Israeli reservists* have been called up to support the impending operations.
- **Timeline Linked to Diplomacy:** Implementation of the plan is delayed until after **President Donald Trump's visit (May 13–16)** to the Middle East, providing a diplomatic "*window of opportunity*" for ceasefire negotiations.

Humanitarian and International Backlash

- **Humanitarian Crisis Deepens:** Community kitchens in Gaza warn of *imminent food exhaustion*. Aid agencies report *blockaded deliveries since March 2*, causing mass hunger, halted bakeries, and failing health services.
- **UN Condemnation:** The **Humanitarian Country Team** and **UN agencies** have condemned Israel's new aid plan via private companies, calling it a *violation of humanitarian principles* and a *military pressure tactic*.
- **Gaza Under Siege:** The Israeli proposal includes a "*sterile area*" in *Rafah*, where displaced Palestinians must undergo inspection to access basic supplies — increasing risks to civilians and aid workers alike.
- **International Disapproval:**
 - **UK** opposed the offensive expansion.

- **EU** expressed concern about increasing *Palestinian suffering*.
- **UN Secretary-General Guterres** warned against further civilian displacement.
- **President Trump**, while supportive of Israel, pledged to ensure food reaches Palestinians.

Political, Civil & Historical Context

- **Historical Occupation Context:** Israel originally occupied Gaza in **1967**, withdrew in **2005**, but retained *control over its airspace, borders, and coastline*, meaning the UN still views Gaza as "occupied territory."
- **Far-Right Political Pressure:** Finance Minister **Bezalel Smotrich** declared the intention to "*finally occupy the Gaza Strip*," indicating strong right-wing influence in Israeli policymaking.
- **October 7 Attacks - The Catalyst:** Israel's campaign stems from **Hamas's 7 October 2023 attack**, which killed *1,200 Israelis* and led to *251 hostages* being taken. It triggered the ongoing war and humanitarian blockade.
- **Mounting Death Toll:** As per Gaza's Hamas-run Health Ministry, **52,567 people** have died since the conflict began, with *2,459 fatalities* since the offensive resumed on March 18.

Domestic & Resistance Voices

- **Hostage Families Oppose War-First Strategy:** The **Hostages and Missing Families Forum** accused the government of prioritising territory over the safe return of the 59 remaining hostages — 24 of whom are still believed to be alive.
- **Hamas's Position:** Hamas demands a **comprehensive ceasefire**, *complete Israeli withdrawal*, *Gaza reconstruction*, and a *mutual prisoner release deal* — rejecting current Israeli terms as coercive.

Gazan Civilians Resist Displacement: Many northern Gaza residents, having already endured harsh conditions in southern "safe zones," are refusing further evacuation. Statements like "*We are staying in Gaza*" reflect widespread civilian defiance.

Operation Sindoor: India's Precision Strike to Dismantle Cross-Border Terror Infrastructure

Context & Trigger: Pahalgam Terror Attack

- **Pahalgam Tragedy Sparks Action:** Operation Sindoor was launched in direct response to the **April 22, 2025** terror attack in **Pahalgam, Anantnag (J&K)** that claimed **26 lives** — **25 Indian citizens** and **1 Nepali national**.
- **Government's Pledge to Avenge:** Prime Minister **Narendra Modi** had vowed to pursue perpetrators to the "**ends of the earth**", promising punishment "**beyond their imagination**."
- **Symbolic Naming: 'Sindoor':** The operation was symbolically named "**Sindoor**" to honour the sacrifice of innocent lives and to reaffirm India's commitment to justice and national integrity.

The Operation: Targets, Execution & Scope

- **Precision Missile Strikes Conducted at 1:44 AM:** On **May 7, 2025**, the Indian Armed Forces executed **24 missile strikes** in a **25-minute** operation starting at **1:05 AM**.
- **Nine Terror Camps Neutralized:** Strikes targeted **9 terrorist facilities** across **Pakistan and Pakistan-Occupied Kashmir (POK)** including **Muridke** and **Bahawalpur** — strongholds of **Lashkar-e-Taiba (LeT)** and **Jaish-e-Mohammed (JeM)** respectively.
- **Over 70 Terrorists Eliminated:** The operation resulted in the deaths of **over 70 terrorists**, with **more than 60 injured**, significantly impairing operational capacity.
- **Avoided Civilian Targets:** Target selection was guided by **credible intelligence**, ensuring **no Pakistani military facilities** or **civilian infrastructure** were harmed.

Strategic Messaging & Diplomacy

- **Measured and Non-Escalatory:** India's Ministry of Defence emphasized that the strikes were "**measured, proportionate, and non-escalatory**", aimed strictly at terror infrastructure.

- **Right to Preemptive Action:** Foreign Secretary **Vikram Misri** stated that India exercised its **right to deter and preempt** cross-border attacks while acting responsibly.
- **Demonstration of Restraint and Capability:** India highlighted its **restraint in execution** and precision targeting, underlining a policy of **surgical retaliation** rather than broader military escalation.

Intelligence Insights & Historic Significance

- **Training Camps of Global Terrorists Targeted:** Camps like **Sawai Nala (Muzaffarabad)** and **Syedna Bilal (POK)** were among the sites destroyed — places where **Ajmal Kasab** and **David Headley** were previously trained.
- **Longstanding Terror Infrastructure:** The targeted locations have historically been used as **launchpads and training hubs** by LeT and JeM, both **UN-designated** terrorist groups.
- **Weapon Storage and Mobilization Hubs Hit:** Intelligence confirmed the sites also served as **staging areas** for arms, ammunition, and **launch preparations** for cross-border infiltration.

Official Statements & Security Drill

- **Wing Commander Vyomika Singh's Briefing:** In a press conference, she confirmed **complete destruction** of nine camps and reiterated that **"justice has been delivered"** for Pahalgam victims.
- **Operation Timed Ahead of Nationwide Drill:** The strikes came **just hours before** a scheduled **civil defence mock drill** across **244 districts** to boost homeland preparedness.
- **Coordinated Strategic Response:** The synchronisation of the strike and drill indicates **multi-agency coordination**, reflecting **India's layered response mechanism** to national threats.

Locations of Major Strikes

- **Sawai Nala Camp (Muzaffarabad):** Deep inside Pakistani territory (~30 km from LoC), a key LeT training centre.

- **Syedna Bilal Camp (POK):** A Jaish-e-Mohammed facility used for **training, arms storage, and launch coordination.**
- **Bahawalpur & Muridke (Pakistan):** Core operational hubs for JeM and LeT, home to their ideological and command leadership.

Conclusion: A Message Beyond Borders

India's Commitment Reinforced: Operation Sindoor sends a clear, strategic message: **India will not tolerate cross-border terrorism**, and any such act will be met with **calibrated, precise and unrelenting response.**

Vatican Conclave 2025: Historic Papal Election Underway Amid Global Anticipation

The Conclave Begins: A Sacred Tradition in Action

- **Inconclusive First Vote (May 7, 2025):** The first day of voting in the papal conclave ended with **black smoke** billowing from the Sistine Chapel, indicating no pope was chosen. The process will resume with four rounds of voting per day from Thursday.
- **Sacred Rituals Observed:** The conclave began with the traditional Latin command "**Extra omnes**" — meaning "everyone out" — as the chapel doors were sealed. The 133 cardinal electors, all under the age of 80, are now in complete seclusion during the voting process.
- **A Global Gathering:** This is **the largest conclave in Church history**, with many cardinals new to the process and representing countries with no previous voice in conclave elections, reflecting the Church's global transformation under Pope Francis.

Inside the Sistine Chapel: Heritage Meets Secrecy

- **Timeless Protocols:** The cardinals are secluded inside the Sistine Chapel, voting beneath **Michelangelo's iconic fresco of God creating Adam**. The setting is steeped in spiritual and artistic tradition.
- **No Phones, No Speeches:** To maintain purity of the process and shield it from **modern-day influences like social media**, cardinals are forbidden from using mobile phones and cannot make speeches or campaign.
- **Health Provisions in Place:** One ill cardinal has been granted the right to vote from his room, showcasing the conclave's effort to include all eligible electors.

Global Speculation: Who Will Wear the White Robes?

- **Americans in the Spotlight:** For the first time in decades, speculation includes U.S. candidates. Notably:
 - **Cardinal Robert Prevost**, a Chicago-born Vatican official known for his pragmatism.
 - **Cardinal Timothy Dolan**, Archbishop of New York, famous for his charisma and media presence.
- **Rising International Figures:** Other top contenders include:
 - **Cristóbal López Romero**, a Spaniard based in Morocco, admired for his humble and Gospel-centric approach.
 - **Anders Arborelius**, a monastic Swedish cardinal and Catholic convert celebrated for his spiritual depth.
 - Cardinals from **Italy, the Philippines, France, and Congo** are also in the mix.

Historical Context & Recent Legacy

- **Longest Conclave in 100+ Years?** If no pope is selected by day five, this could become the longest conclave since 1922 — a sign of possible division or a careful deliberative process.
- **Past Precedents:** Pope Francis and Pope Benedict XVI were elected in just **five and four votes**, respectively. A similar timeline could point to consensus, while

delays may reflect internal tensions.

- **Legacy of Pope Francis:** Following Francis's death, the conclave reflects **his reformist impact**—from increased global diversity among cardinals to emphasis on humility and Gospel values.

Ceremony and Symbolism

- **Litany and Vestments:** Cardinals entered the conclave chanting the **Litany of the Saints**, wearing red sashes, rochet vests, pectoral crosses, and birettas — or, for Eastern Churches, traditional choir dress.
- **The Room of Tears:** After selection, the new pope will dress in white vestments in the **"Room of Tears"**, symbolic of the gravity and emotional weight of the papal role.

What to Expect Next

- **White Smoke and Latin Announcement:** Once a pope is chosen, white smoke will rise. The cardinal protodeacon will then announce the new pontiff's name from the balcony of **St. Peter's Basilica** with the phrase **"Habemus Papam."**

First Impressions Matter: Observers will scrutinize whether the new pope adopts Francis's simple style (white robes and black shoes) or returns to **Benedict's ornate red slippers and velvet mozzetta**.

Strategic Retaliation & Resilience: India's Decisive Counter to Pakistan's Cross-Border Assaults

BACKGROUND: Escalation in the Aftermath of the Pahalgam Attack

- **Operation Sindoor Launched Post-Pahalgam Tragedy:** India's military retaliation, *Operation Sindoor*, began following the **Pahalgam terror attack in April 2025**, which resulted in **26 civilian deaths**, most of them tourists. The operation targets **nine terror infrastructure locations** in Pakistan and Pakistan-Occupied Kashmir (POK).
- **Restraint Meets Resolve:** Defence Minister **Rajnath Singh** addressed the nation, reaffirming India's commitment to diplomacy but warning that **restraint must not be**

misinterpreted as weakness, emphasizing “quality action” in response to provocations.

THE STRIKES: Pakistan’s Provocation and India’s Defence

- **Massive Missile and Drone Barrage by Pakistan:** On May 8–9, 2025, Pakistan launched its **second wave of drone and missile strikes within 24 hours**, targeting **over 15 Indian cities** including Jammu, Pathankot, Srinagar, Amritsar, Ludhiana, Chandigarh, and others.
- **Targets Across the Nation:** Pakistani attempts were focused on **military installations**, especially in **Jammu & Kashmir, Punjab, Rajasthan, and Gujarat**, aiming at critical nodes like **Awantipura, Bathinda, Uttarlai, and Bhuj**.
- **Coordinated Night-Time Attack Foiled:** India’s **air defence systems** — including **CUAS, Pechora missiles, SAMAR systems, and air defence guns** — **intercepted all major threats**, preventing any **casualties or material losses**.

INDIA’S RESPONSE: Swift, Tactical, and Unrelenting

- **Pre-Dawn Precision Strike Near Lahore:** In a **pre-dawn counter-offensive**, India deployed **kamikaze drones** to **neutralise a key Pakistani air defence system near Lahore**, showcasing advanced **kinetic and non-kinetic warfare capabilities**.
- **“Same Domain, Same Intensity” Doctrine:** According to the **Defence Ministry**, India’s response was calibrated to match the **intensity and nature** of Pakistan’s provocation, targeting **radars and defence infrastructure**.
- **Blackouts Across Indian States:** As a precautionary protocol, **controlled blackouts** were enforced in **Jammu & Kashmir, Punjab, Rajasthan, and Chandigarh**, allowing anti-air systems to operate with maximum efficiency and reducing visibility for incoming threats.

IMPACT ZONES & CIVILIAN SAFETY

- **Explosions and Sirens Alert Border Areas:** Explosions were reported in **Akhnoor, Samba, Baramulla, and Kupwara**, while **air raid sirens** prompted civilians to take shelter. No **civilian or defence casualties** were reported.
- **Cities Temporarily in Darkness:** Jammu, Amritsar, Pathankot, Jalandhar, Mohali, and other districts witnessed power cuts to safeguard critical infrastructure. Electricity has now been **restored in many areas**.

- **Security Vigil Heightened Along LoC:** Ceasefire violations (CFVs) were also reported along the **Line of Control (LoC)**, triggering enhanced surveillance and **aerial vigilance across border sectors**.

STRATEGIC POSTURING & GLOBAL MESSAGE

- **High-Tech Warfare on Display:** The use of **counter-drone technology**, **air defence integration**, and **precision-targeting drones** reflects a **modernised Indian defence posture**, drawing attention from international defence analysts.
- **Neutralisation of Pakistani Jets:** According to defence sources, Indian systems also **downed Pakistani F-16 and JF-17 fighter jets**, and reportedly **disabled a PAF AWACS surveillance aircraft**, further **weakening Pakistan's aerial monitoring capability**.
- **Public and Global Assurance:** The Ministry of Defence assured that India's **air defence remains impregnable**, and any future threats will be met with **rapid, proportionate, and effective responses**.
